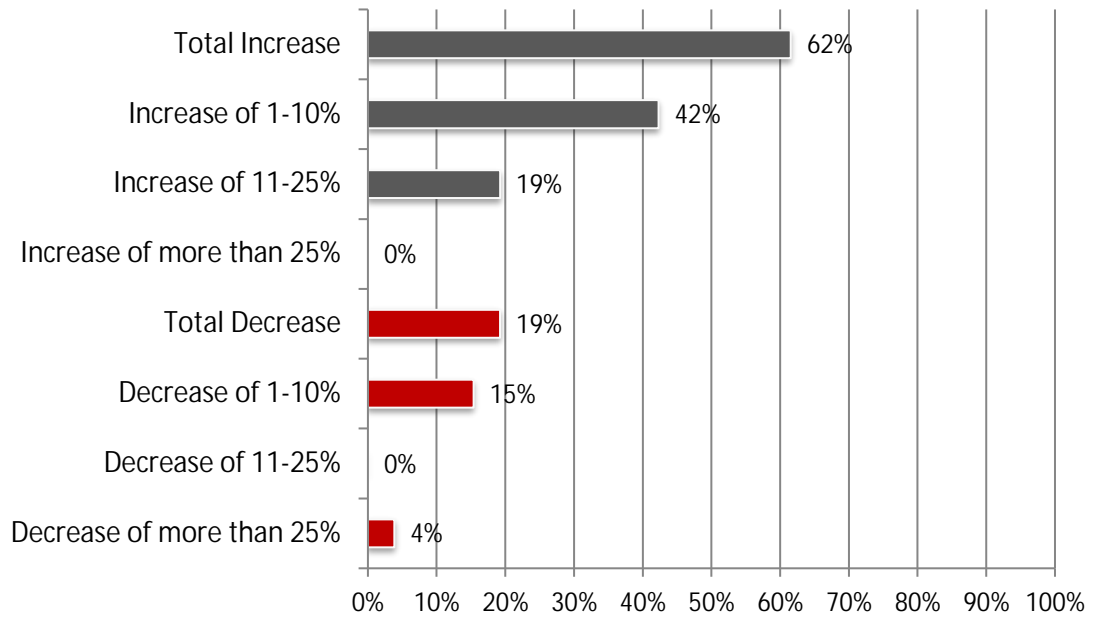


## 2025 Construction Outlook Illinois Survey Results

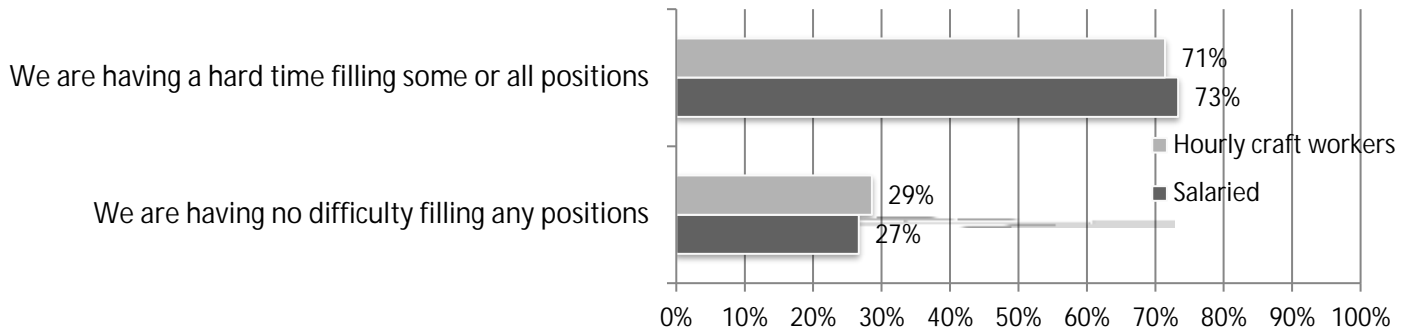

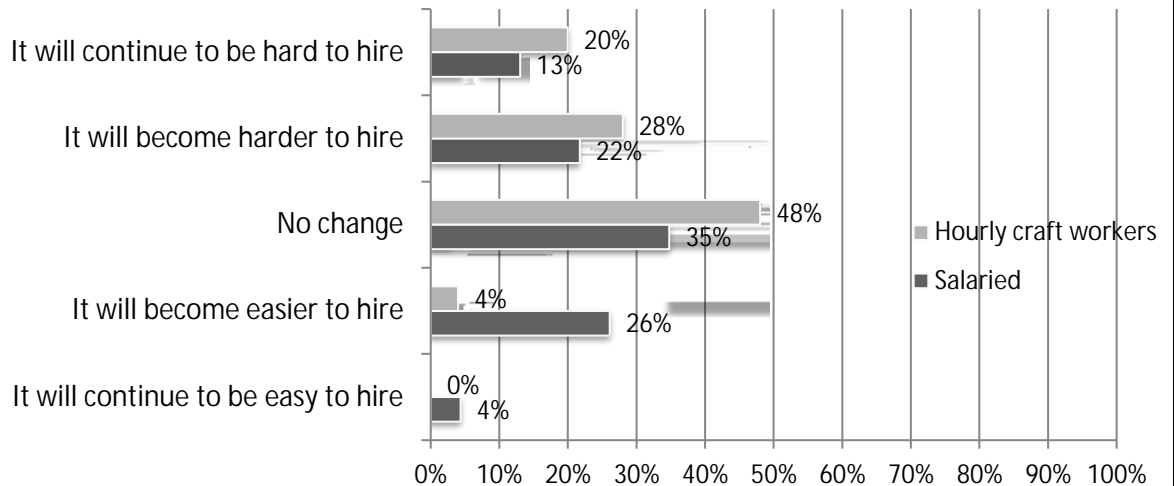
2. What percentage change do you expect in your headcount in 2025? Responses: 26



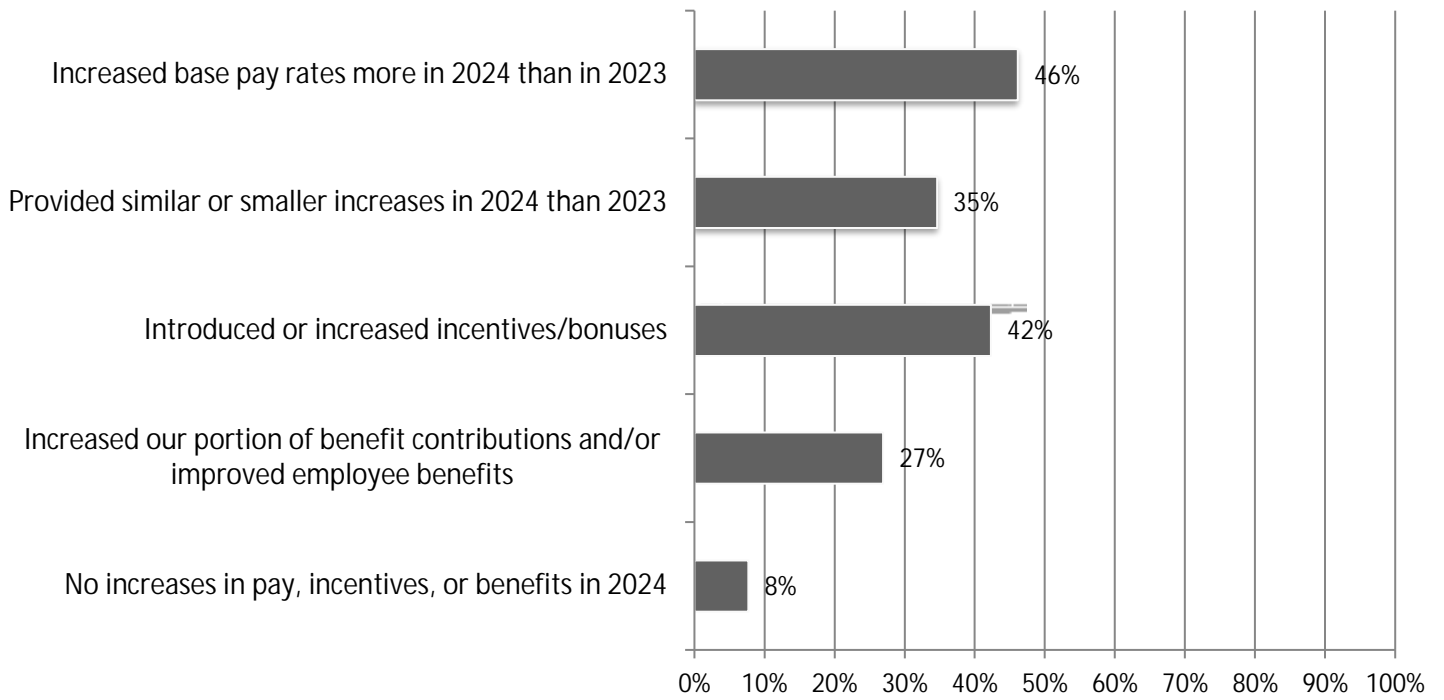
3. Describe your difficulty in filling open positions: Responses: 26



4. Do you expect any changes in the availability of hourly craft or salaried personnel over the coming 12 months? Responses: 26



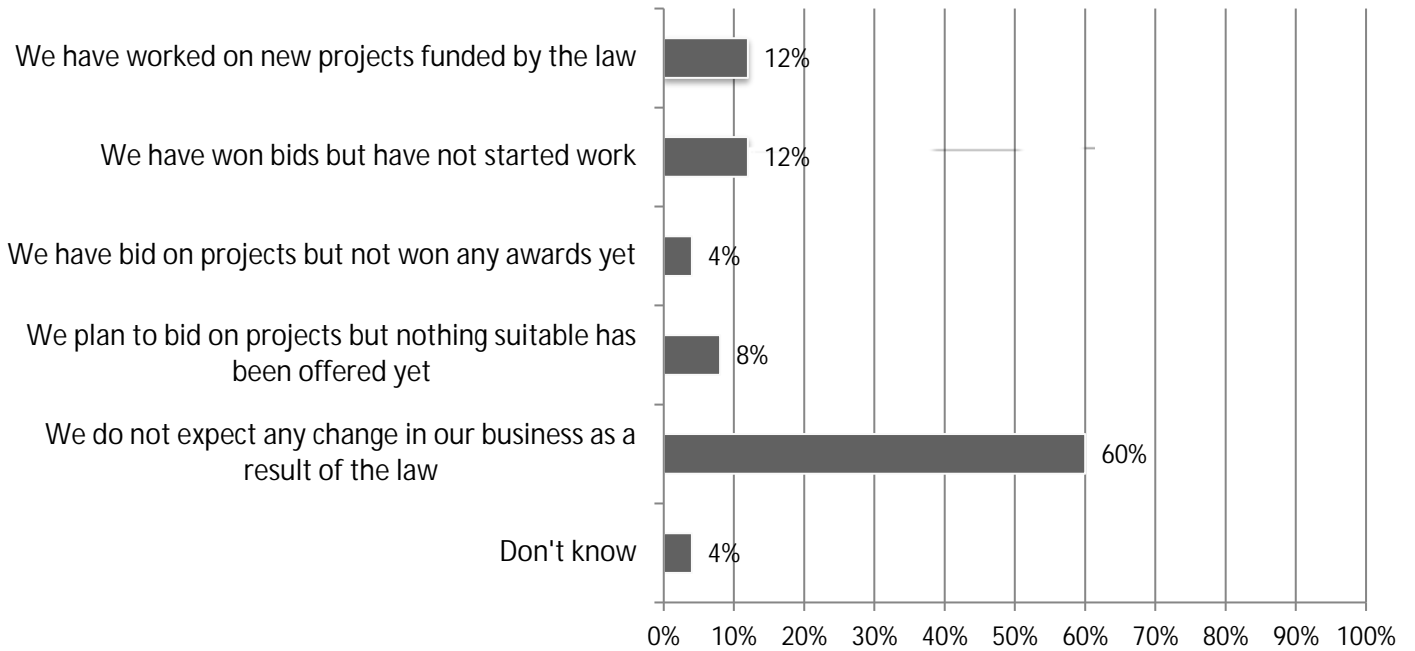
5. What changes did your firm make in pay or benefits in 2024? (mark all that apply) Responses: 26



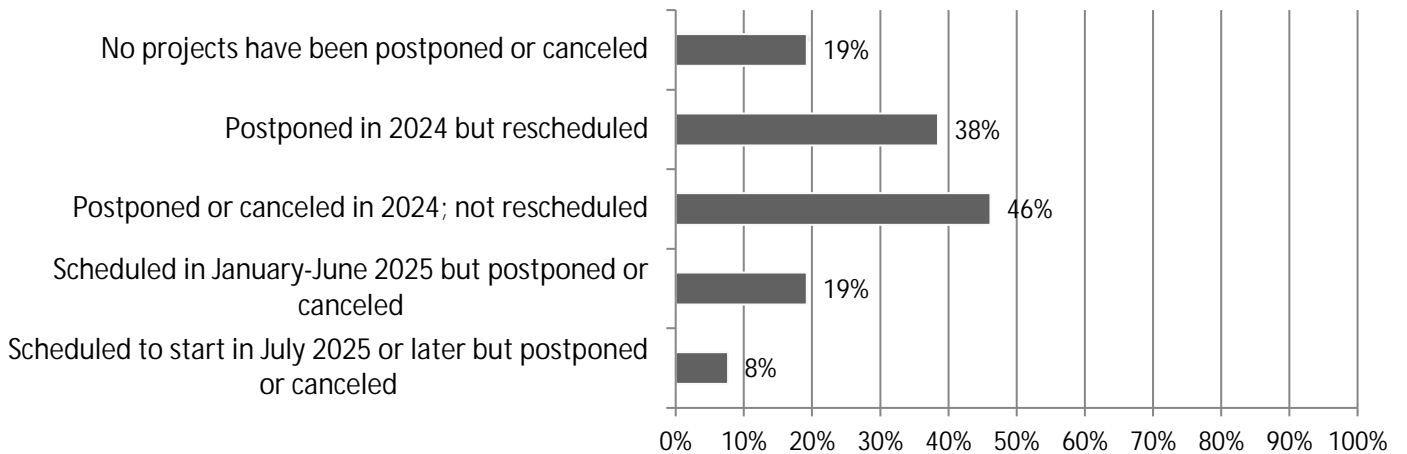

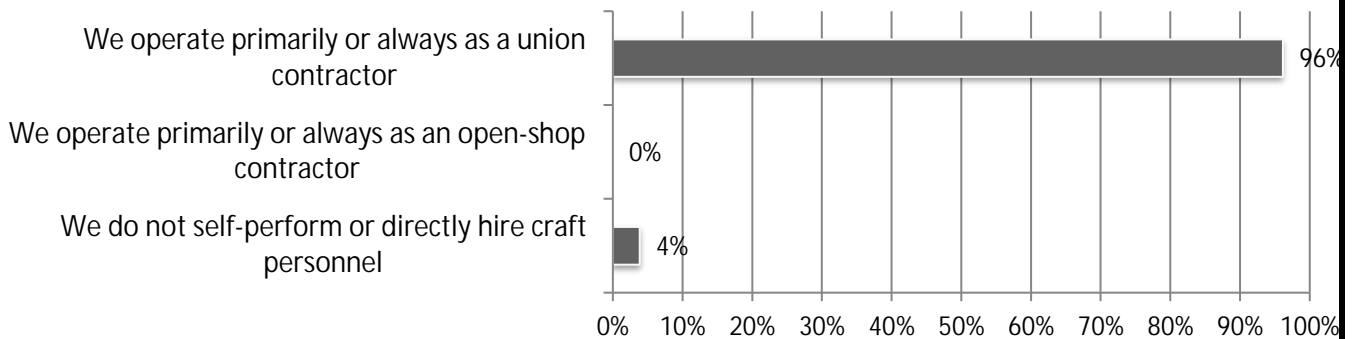
