

- x In Michigan, construction contributed 29 billion (4.2%) of the state's GDP d 703 billion.
- x Therewere 943,000 constructionestablishments in the U.S. in the duarter of 2024 including 26,500 in Michigan. (An establishment is a fixed business location; about 99% of construction firms have only one establishment.)

**Construction Spending:** 

- x Nonresidential spending in the U.S. totaled \$1.1 trillion in 20236(\$illion private, \$40 billion public).
- x Residential construction spending in the U.S. totaled 8980 fion (\$400 billion singlefamily, \$136 billion multifamily, \$331 billion improvements, \$11 billion public).
- x Private nonresidential spending init init init and totaled \$12 billion in 2023. State and local spending total and billion. (Totals are not available for residential, railroad, power, communication, or federal construction

Construction EmploymentSeasonally Adjusted):

- x Construction (residential + nonresidential) employed raillion workers in August 2024, an increase of 28,000 (2.8%) from August 2023 and an increase of 7% from February 2020, the peak prendemic month.
- x Construction employment in Mahiganin August2024totaled 205,100 an increaseof 15,100 (8%) from August2023 and an increaseof 27,300 or 15% from February 2020

Construction Industry Pay:

x Construction jobs pay well. Michigan,5 out of the 5 mostnumerousconstructionoccupationshad median annual pay exceeding he median for all employed 2023. (Half of workers earn more than the median; half earn less.)
